PLEASE READ!

THERE IS A DIFFERENT APPROACH THIS YEAR FOR PAYING YOUR ALUMNAE DUES.

In past years, the Per Capita Dues paid to Executive Offices (EO) were included as part of the local dues payment, with the Kansas City chapter sending \$19.00 to EO for each member. This year, EO is piloting a program for our region where they will send a separate request for the Per Capita Dues directly to each Delta Gamma alumna. The goal of this program is to increase the number of active alumnae. The separate request is scheduled to be mailed from EO in September. As always, we urge you to support the national Fraternity.

This change in billing means we are reducing our local dues by \$19.00 to take into account the separate billing you will receive this fall from EO. The revised local dues schedule for this year is:
